Dear Superintendent:

I am writing to invite you and a team from your district to participate in a conference for districts with Persistently Struggling and Struggling Schools to be held on Wednesday, July 22, 2015 and Thursday, July 23, 2015 at the Empire State Plaza Convention Center, Albany, NY 12242. Also invited are key stakeholders who are involved in supporting turnaround efforts in New York State schools.

The purpose of this conference is to provide guidance to the field on how to implement the Receivership program as outlined in Commissioner's Regulation §100.19, which the Board of Regents approved, as an emergency action, at its June 2015 meeting (see: http://www.regents.nysed.gov/common/regents/files/meetings/Revised%20Receivership%20100.19_0.pdf.)

We are requesting that *five representatives from your district* participate in this very important conference. Representatives attending the conference should include the Superintendent or Superintendent's Designee, a representative selected by the organization that represents the principal(s) of the identified school(s) in the district, a representative selected by the organization that represents the teachers assigned to identified school(s) in the district, a parent selected by the organization that represents parents whose students attend identified school(s) in the district, and a School Board representative. Please review the attached draft agenda in preparation for this very important conference.

Day One of the conference will convene from 10:30 AM to 5:30 PM and include sessions on the implementation of Commissioner's Regulation §100.19, development of the required Community Engagement Plan, an overview of the metrics that will be utilized to determine Demonstrable Improvement, and the permissible activities for the \$75 million School Turnaround Grant Program for which Persistently Struggling Schools are eligible to apply. Day Two will convene from 9:00 AM to 3:30 PM and include presentations by Community Schools experts and School Turnaround experts.

In order to confirm your attendance at the Wednesday, July 22, 2015 and Thursday, July 23, 2015 conference, we ask that each representative who will attend the School Receivership conference on behalf of your organization register beginning on Wednesday, July 2, 2015 at 12:00 PM and ending on Monday, July 13, 2015 at 5:00 PM by visiting: <https://nysed.fluidreview.com/>.
