Please note that the Department will continue to provide schools with the Braille edition and large-type edition for use by the visually impaired.

Reference Tables for Physical Setting/Chemistry, 2011 Edition

The *Reference Tables for Physical Setting/Chemistry, 2011 Edition*, has been revised to reflect the latest information on the subject. Some of the tables have been moved to different pages, while others have been enlarged or replaced with updated versions. The 2011 edition replaces all previous editions and should be used at the start of the 2011-12 school year.

Reference Tables for Physical Setting/Earth Science, 2011 Edition

The *Reference Tables for Physical Setting/Earth Science, 2011 Edition*, has the same content as the 2010 edition, except that the ruler on the cover has been removed. Students will no longer need to use this ruler on the Regents Exam in Physical Setting/Earth Science. Because only the ruler was removed, schools may continue to use any 2010 edition reference tables already on hand in their classrooms.

No changes have been made to the *Reference Tables for Physical Setting/Physics, 2006 Edition*. Schools may continue to use any 2006 edition reference tables already on hand in their classrooms.
