This form must only be used by schools that have been directly notified to submit an early summary of the violent and disruptive incidents that took place in their schools, July 1, 2013 through June 30, 2014. It only contains Sections 1 and 9 of the VADIR form that will need to be filed via BEDS IMF application in September of 2014. PART 1: VIOLENT AND DISRUPTIVE INCIDENT REPORTING (VADIR): VADIR incidents must be reported in only one category. If an incident involves more than one category, report it only in the most serious category. For example: if an incident involves robbery (category 3) and assault with physical injury (category 7), report the incident in category 3 (robbery). For all categories, at least one offender must be reported for each incident. If an offender is unknown, report the incident as having an offender of "Other." For incidents in categories 1 through 4, categories 6 through 13 and category 20, at least one victim must be reported for each incident. Note that both the school (as an entity) and the offender (as an individual) can be the victims of an incident. For incidents in categories 1 through 8 and any incident involving a weapon (as defined in the VADIR Glossary), consequences for student offenders must result in a disciplinary or referral action listed in columns (j) through (o). Consequences are not required for staff and other/unknown offenders. Incidents in categories 9-13, 16, and 20 should be reported only if a weapon was involved or if the consequences result in a disciplinary or referral action listed in columns (j) through (o). Schools reporting no incidents must report zero (0) in categories 1-20 column (a) and Item 4. Questions must be answered in Item 7 and Item 8, and the superintendent certifications must be completed. 1. Violent and Disruptive Incidents: Report duplicated counts of offenders and victims. That is to say, offenders and victims must be counted each time they were involved in an incident.
