For all categories, at least one offender must be reported for each incident. If an offender is unknown, report the incident as having an offender of "Other," For incidents in categories 1 through 4, categories 6 through 13 and category 20, at least one victim must be reported for each incident. Note that both the school (as an entity) and the offender (as an individual) can be the victims of an incident. Schools reporting no incidents must report zero (0) in categories 1-20 column (a) and Item 4. Questions must be answered in Item 7 and Item 8, and the superintendent/charter school leader information sections must be completed.
