From 1999-00 to 2009-10, total expenditures increased \$24 billion (75.7%) while State Funds increased \$9.7 billion (70.9%). For the current year, total expenditures by school districts are expected to be \$58 billion, an increase of \$1.4 billion over the amount spent in the previous year. Under existing legislation, State Funds are expected to meet 39.3 percent of these expenditures.
