School Violence Index:

[for SED use]

The School Violence Index (SVI) for designating persistently dangerous and watch list schools is calculated by multiplying the counts of each type of incident by the weight for that incident category and summing the products (sum of the “(A X B)” column). The result is then divided by the enrollment.

Criteria for designation as a persistently dangerous school

Schools may be designated as persistently dangerous if for two consecutive school years they meet either of the following criteria: 1) The school has an SVI of 1.5 or greater; OR 2) The school has an SVI of 0.5 or greater, plus a total of 60 or more weighted incidents.
