New York State's Board of Cooperative Educational Services (BOCES) Report Cards, required by Chapter 436 of the Laws of 1997, will be made available to the public on April 15, 2002. These report cards reflect the State Education Department's commitment to public reporting on the performance of the State's educational system. It is part of a strategy to raise the educational performance of students. The BOCES provide shared programs and services addressing a variety of educational, administrative and technical needs of component districts. The report cards summarize program accomplishments and services that BOCES provide for children and adults. They are intended to be used as a tool for the continuous improvement of BOCES programs and services and for providing information to communities.
