Special education data are collected through the Student Information Repository System (SIRS) and the PD system. The primary documentation for data that must be submitted through SIRS is the 2008-09 SIRS Manual, which will be available at the two websites previously referenced. The documentation for data that must be submitted directly through the PD data system is included with the PD-6 and PD-8 forms and in the Self Review Monitoring Protocols for special education State Performance Plan (SPP) Indicators 4, 9, 10 and 13. This data set also includes an indication of whether the child is found eligible for preschool special education and requires a reason for determining eligibility past the child's third birthday for children who are found not eligible for preschool special education.
