Subject: Modernization of Health Education Curriculum Law

This memorandum announces the Health Education Standards Modernization Supplemental Guidance Document: An Instructional Resource Packet for Heroin and Opioids developed to assist school districts to meet requirements of modernizing health education instruction by including heroin and opioid content within the alcohol, tobacco, and other drugs curricula. Paragraph a of subdivision 4 of section 804 of the Education Law, as amended by Chapter 181 of the laws of 2000, was amended in response to the increase in heroin and opioid abuse in New York State and across the nation.

When updating health education curriculum, school districts should ensure that it is grade level appropriate and aligned to the New York State Health Education Learning Standards. These Learning Standards, the Health Education Guidance Document and the new supplemental guide for heroin and opioids, along with additional resources for schools can be found at the New York State Education Department's Health Education Website http://www.p12.nysed.gov/sss/schoolhealth/schoolhealtheducation/.

As part of a multi-pronged and coordinated State effort, the supplemental guide was created in partnership with the New York State Office of Alcoholism and Substance Abuse Services http://www.oasas.ny.gov/ whose expertise provided critical evidenceinformation. and the NYS Department of Health based AIDS Institute https://www.health.ny.gov/ which has provided valuable knowledge on Opioid Overdose Prevention Programs. Preventing drug abuse among students is essential; therefore, the Department will continue providing statewide communication on the dangers of statewide heroin opioids.
