What is Contracts for Excellence?

The Contracts for Excellence program was established in the 2007-08 school year as an accountability measure for school districts with at least one academically underperforming school and whose Foundation Aid growth was set to exceed certain thresholds.



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What is Contracts for Excellence?

The "contract amount" is a subset of Foundation Aid that a district must program toward specific uses as described in NYS Education Law § 211-d.

Contract funds must predominantly benefit pupils with the greatest educational needs, including but not be limited to:

- Economically disadvantaged students
- Students with disabilities
- English-language learners
- Students struggling with proficiency



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What sort of expenditures comply with program requirements?

The law specifies six categories of allowable programs and activities:

- 1. Class size reduction
- 2. Increased time on task
- 3. Teacher and principal quality initiatives
- 4. Middle and high school restructuring
- 5. Full-day pre-kindergarten and kindergarten
- 6. Model programs for English language learners

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What is my District's 2023-24 Contract Amount?

The full phase-in of Foundation Aid increases the contract amounts significantly for 2023-24. In consideration of the challenges districts may face in planning and programming the increased set-aside amounts in a single year, the Commissioner of Education has authorized a three-year contract increase phase-in: 20% in 2023-24, and 40% in both 2024-25 and 2025-26. New York State Education Law § 211-d(1)(e) provides some flexibility in setting annual contract amounts, however the set amount in any given year shall not be less than the amount set for the year prior.

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What are the steps to completing a Contract for Excellence?

 Consult with stakeholder groups— Parents/Guardians, Teachers, Administrators (May-June)

2. Prepare and submit a DRAFT Contract (July)



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What are the steps to completing a Contract for Excellence?

- 3. Publicize proposed Contract for Excellence and post on District website for Public Comment Period (July-August)
- 4. Post assessments of Public Comments, if any (August)
- Submit FINAL Contract for Excellence to NYSED for review and approval, post FINAL Contract for Excellence and Public Comments on District website (August)



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Additional C4E Reporting Requirements

The law requires that all districts send final expenditure reports related to Contracts for Excellence to NYSED for review.

Additionally, all districts must provide a report, certified by an independent auditor, that C4E funds expended in the previous year were spent and accounted for properly.

If the audit returns any findings, a corrective action plan must also be sent to NYSED for review.



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Contracts for Excellence Website

All forms, guidance, and process calendars are posted on the web at <u>https://www.p12.nysed.gov/mgtserv/C4E/</u>. Documents include a table of Needs/Weights for every school building in the district, showing percentages of economically disadvantaged students, students with disabilities, and English language learners. The Needs/Weights tables will help the district program C4E funds to the required targeted populations.

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Navigating the Contract Amount Increase

Districts may find it difficult to program the increased Contracts for Excellence amount, given the large increase. However, many of the requirements for expending federal ARP-ESSER funding overlap with Contracts for Excellence requirements. A district may consider shifting ARP-funded programs to being funded with C4E dollars, especially since ARP funding is set to expire in September 2024. This can free-up ARP monies for other, more broadly allowable uses in the 2023-24 school year.



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Navigating the Contract Amount Increase

NYSED can provide technical assistance on cross-walking ARP-funded programs to the Contracts for Excellence Foundation Aid set-aside.
